RE: California OEHHA Prop 65

To Our Valued Customers:


Proposition 65, officially known as the “Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986,” is a California statute that requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposure to these chemicals.

Revisions to the Proposition 65 regulations affect both the method of transmission as well as the content of the preferred warnings. These revisions are effective on August 30, 2018. However, companies may begin complying with the new label regulations now. It is important to note that these revisions affect only the safe-harbor label requirements – the form of notice that is “officially” approved by the State. Other notices are permitted; and whether a product should bear a label is not affected by the revised regulations.

TenCate Geosynthetics is aware of these revisions. We have used this as an opportunity to survey our supply chain for the appearance of Proposition 65 listed chemicals above any “no significant risk level” (NSRL) for cancer or the “maximum allowable dose level” (MADL) for reproductive harm. In addition, we have taken into consideration our own manufacturing processes.

Some Proposition 65 listed chemicals appear in the raw materials we receive from our suppliers, but they are not reportable. **As a result, additional labeling to comply with California OEHHA Prop 65 is not required for our products.** We provide clear and reasonable notice via labeling or by other legally sufficient communication methods when appropriate. TenCate Geosynthetics continually conducts quality reviews of our products and raw materials and reserves the right to label any product as appropriate should disclosure be required for goods known to be distributed within the State of California.
